New Boston Property Management

Adopted: Resolution 2011-01; January 25, 2011

A. Inside Apartment

1 General

- a. Walls should be clean, free of dirt, grease, holes, cobwebs, and fingerprints.
- b. Floors should be clean, clear, dry and free of hazards.
- c. Ceilings should be clean and free of cobwebs.
- d. Windows should be clean. Shades and blinds should be clean and in-tact.
- e. Woodwork should be clean, free of dust, gouges, or scratches.
- f. Doors should be clean, free of grease and fingerprints. Doorstops should be present. Locks should work.

Heating unit closets should be dusted and access uncluttered.

- h. Trash shall be disposed of properly and not left in the unit.
- *i.* Entire unit should be free *of rodent or insect infestation*.
- *j.* Hallways should be clean and free of hazards.
- k. Light fixtures and ceiling fans should be clean and operable.

2 Kitchen

- a. Stove should be clean and free of food and grease
- b. Refrigerator should be clean. Freezer should not be overfilled. Door gaskets should be cleaned to prevent sticking.
- c. Cabinets should be clean and neat; cabinet surfaces and counter top should be free of grease and spilled food. Storage under the sink should be limited to small or lightweight items to permit access to repairs.
- d. Range hood fan should be free of grease and dust
- e. Sink should be clean, free of grease and garbage. Dirty dishes should be
